Course Description

This year in Math 6 the students will be working hard on their fundamentals, understanding math's daily life applications, and building the foundation for the advanced math they will need in the future. Topics covered will be decimals, fractions, ratios, proportions, percents, integers, data analysis and graphs, equation solving, basic geometry, inequalities, and probability.

The retake grade will replace the original grade, however the highest grade possible on a re-take shall be a 77%.

*Extra Help is held on Wednesday afternoons. Pick up is promptly at 3:30 pm. Students should come prepared to Extra Help with questions with which they are having trouble. I cannot guarantee one-on-one time during extra help sessions.
